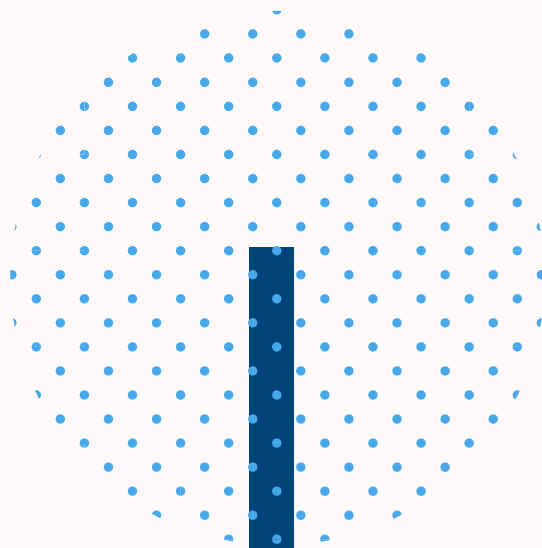

THE BASICS

THE FEW BASIC THINGS TO REMEMBER IN ORDER
TO BE ABLE TO PRONOUNCE THE WORDS

Γ - G - GAMMA

THE THIRD LETTER OF THE ALPHABET CAN BE A
TRICKY ONE. DO NOT BE TEMPTED TO
PRONOUNCE AS THE HARSH "G" SOUND UNLESS:

$\Gamma + K = G$

$\Gamma + \Gamma = G$

Γ IN MOST OTHER INSTANCES IS PRONOUNCED
AS THE FIRST SOUND IN WHY!

I - H - Y

HERE WE HAVE IOTA, ETA AND EPSILON
THEY MOSTLY ARE PRONOUNCED AS THE EE
SOUND IN MACHINE.

E - EPSILON

THIS IS NOT AN EE SOUND, UNLESS IT IS
FOLLOWED BY AN "I", BUT LETS NOT GO THERE.
WHEN YOU SEE EPSILON - ASSUME IT IS
PRONOUNCED LIKE THE "E" IN PET.

Yia sou can be used as a greeting both when first meeting someone and when leaving.

YEEA - SAS

when speaking to groups of people or those older than you to show respect

used when going to sleep. Can use KALO VRA-THEE for a casual goodbye greeting.
